

## **John T. Horton Research Paper Prize Information**

The Horton Research Paper Prize was established in honor of Dr. John T. Horton (1901-1991) who was chairman of the History Department from 1948 to 1967. Professor Horton was admired for his undergraduate teaching and his courses remained vital in the memory of his students long after they graduated. The prize consists of a departmental certificate and a cash award of approximately \$500 given each year for the best research paper.

ELIGIBILITY: Only major research projects, such as honors theses and semester-long independent research projects are eligible. Rough drafts are eligible. Essays must be submitted to the Office of Undergraduate Studies, 540 Park Hall, by **April 20**. Students must submit a clean copy of the essay without any indication of the author's name or the course for which it was written and complete a competition entry form.

Selection of award winners is determined by the History Department's Undergraduate Committee. Awardees will be notified at the end of the spring semester, and their award will be announced at the History Department's graduation ceremony.
